

LAND INFORMATION COUNCIL

February 18, 2026

The Land Information Council met on Wednesday February 18, 2026 at 2:00 p.m. in the County Board Room 264 of the Administration Building, 111 S. Jefferson Street, Lancaster, Wisconsin.

Members present: Robert Keeney, Shane Drinkwater, Tiffany Ehlen, Keith Lane, Carrie Eastlick, Steve Braun, and Steve Morgan with Chris Johll participating via Zoom. Others present: Jesse Klein and Nate Dreckman.

Robert Keeney verified that the meeting was in compliance with the open meeting law, posted in the Courthouse, Administration Building and on the county website. Bob offered to take minutes.

Tiffany Ehlen, second by Keith Lane made a motion to approve the Agenda as posted. Motion carried by voice vote.

Tiffany Ehlen, second by Shane Drinkwater made a motion to approve the March 25, 2025 meeting minutes. Motion carried by voice vote. June 26, 2025 minutes will be presented at a future meeting.

Tiffany Ehlen presented information related to the opportunity to apply for a NG911 Grant available through Wisconsin Department of Military Affairs Office of Emergency Communications. The Track 1 grant funding would cover data remediation, data maintenance, and data synchronization with the assistance of a third-party provider to establish work flow via a document management system. The process would provide integration and data sharing amongst all departments from creation of address points through any requests or changes made to these address points. After discussion, Keith Lane made the motion to apply for a grant in the amount of \$24, 600 with the County match of 5% coming from available budgeted dollars for contracted services. The motion was seconded by Steve Braun and carried without a negative vote.

There was limited discussion on the reinstatement of the PLSS Remonumentation Bounty Program.

Land Information received an email from County Surveyor Jay Adams prior to the meeting. Discussion pointed to further investigation and opportunity for a full time Grant County Surveyor to be shared by County Departments. Information gathering will take place with a decision on funding, location, and the timing of posting to be addressed at a March meeting of the Land Information Council.

Keith Lane informed the Council that Catilis permitting software is being discussed with hopes of framework establishment in May with August migration, prior to the current product end of life.

Tiffany Ehlen reported that she continues to work on updates of our parcel information for the V12 submission. 2578 parcels have been updated and approximately 432 corners in Grant County are identified with survey grade coordinates.
